### WORKING SESSIONS REPORT APRIL to JUNE 2022

We have continued to receive excellent turnouts in the last three months with an average of 15 volunteers. On the April session more plug plants were planted and several areas on both reserves cleared including an alcove alongside the circular path on Alexandrina Plantation. In May we cleared the bridle path and checked all main paths for overgrowing vegetation. We also sowed seed on the Thoresby Rd wildflower area as soon as the area had been rotovated which was two weeks after the working session. By June weeds were growing at a pace so the priority was to clear all the minor paths on both reserves. As always litter was collected each month.
